Spiritual Practice for Advent Three:

"Thank the Messenger"

John 1:8 "He came to testify to the light"

The focus of the third week of Advent is on the *messenger* who prepares the way for Christ. God sends various people into our lives who are messengers that share the hope and love of Christ with us.
