

Spiritual Practice for Advent Four:

"Sing with Mary"

Luke 1:38
"Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word."

The focus of this day is on rejoicing for the coming of the Messiah. Mary is our role model and guide for courageous joy as we prepare for Christmas.
