Worship

Ash Wednesday

March 5, 7:30 am, 12:30 pm & 6:30 pm (Chapel)

Pastor Danyelle, preaching

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent. Lent is a time when many Christians prepare for Easter by observing a period of fasting, repentance, moderation and spiritual discipline. Through the imposition of ashes, Ash Wednesday emphasizes two themes: our sinfulness before God and our human mortality.

Sundays in Lent

March 9-April 6

The theme of prayer will guide us on the 40-day journey through Lent. For five Sundays, we will explore different aspects of prayer in the Christian life with a sermon and study series entitled *Paths of Prayer*.

Palm/Passion Sunday

April 13

A service of readings and music celebrates Christ's glorious entry into Jerusalem on Sunday through his Passion on Friday. The service opens with palm branches waving and shouts of "Hosanna" but as the story of the passion unfolds, their shouts of joy turn to

demands for his crucifixion; he receives a crown of thorns as he is handed over to be mocked and killed.

Maundy Thursday

April 17, 7:00 pm

Maundy Thursday commemorates the day Jesus celebrated the Last Supper with his disciples and washed their feet. Later that night, he went with them to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray. But the disciples fell asleep, leaving Jesus alone in his dark night of the soul. With music, prayers and readings, journey from the Upper Room to the Garden as we remember and experience anew the events of Maundy Thursday.

Good Friday Stations of the Cross

Join us as we walk through the neighborhood in remembrance of the way of Christ to Golgotha. This is an opportunity to learn about the community. The group will depart from the West Entrance at 11:00am and will return in time for the 12:00pm community service.

Celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ with a joyful and festive worship experience. At 8:30am, we will have Holy Communion. At 11:00am, the Carolers will share special music along with presentations by the Cathedral Singers.

Meditation & Contemplative Prayer

Meditation & Contemplative Prayer is a method of silent prayer that prepares us to receive the gift of experiencing God's presence within us, closer than breathing, closer than thinking, closer than consciousness itself. This method of prayer is both a relationship with God and a discipline to foster that relationship. All are welcome to join this group and experience the voice of God in the power of silence and meditation.

Taize

4th Sunday of the Month, 5:00 pm (Chapel)

Prayer and silence are at the heart of the Taize experience; there is no sermon. Taize music highlights simple phrases, usually from the Psalms or other pieces of scripture, which are repeated or sung in canon. The repetition is designed to help meditation and prayer during candlelit services.
