

Gene Allan Scott, 85, passed away Tuesday, February 23, 2021. Gene was born January 26, 1936 in Decatur, IL to the late Edward and Lenora (Huber) Scott. Gene attended Millikin University and DeVry Institute, where he received his training in Telecommunications. Gene started his own radio station in Decatur, IL; had his own business before joining Comcast as General Manager of the Muzak franchise. Gene ended his career with Allied Telecommunications, where he was the senior designer and was a major contributor to their success.

Previously, throughout his life, Gene was involved with many corporate and civic organizations in Indianapolis and most recently served as Past President of the Indiana Recording Club, and he was a faithful member of North UMC, where he served on various boards.
