Our cover art comes from a small portion of one of the many beautiful banners throughout North created by the late Doris Douglas, a long-time member, and other artists. This "Tree of Life" banner was created by Susanne Dice. At the bottom of the banner (not shown) are roots of the tree extending downward to find their foundation around the Chi Rho, the monogram of Christ. Branches bearing fruit and reaching toward heaven extend upward. This reminds us of our anchor in Christ, allowing us continuous regeneration, symbolizing immortality.

Tuesday Nights Together


Discipleship And Formation
