Worship and the Arts

Morning Prayers

Mondays through Fridays, 9:30 a.m. (Chapel) Join us any weekday morning for this short (approximately 15-minute) service of intercessory prayer and praise, where we lift up the prayer requests of the congregation.

Meditation and Contemplative Prayer

Hamilton Series: "Why Should *Music* Matter to People of Faith" by Dr. Jeremy Begbie

The lecture and the anthems are presented by the Richard E. and Anna Lee Hamilton Series on Theology and Contemporary Issues, which is funded by the William E. Schmidt Foundation with additional support from the Blankenbaker-Noyes family.

Pastor Darren will lead a five-week review of the first 11 chapters of Genesis, which contains the origin stories of the most basic human experiences and




desires. Each week we will go beyond Genesis and explore how each topic develops throughout the rest of the Old and New Testaments.



High School Sunday School (Room 008)

Students in grades 10-12 can join their peers in a discussion-based class focusing on the application of faith to real-world scenarios, events, and issues. Each month will have a theme for the discussions, which can range from the history of Christian viewpoints and response to a certain topic, to discussing actions we can take now to live out our faith. This class serves as a safe place for students to discuss and discern their developing faith together as a group. There is no registration required, so students can join anytime.

Middle School Sunday School (Room 207)

Students in grades seven through nine are invited to join their peers every Sunday morning in a discussion-based class focused on faith development, confirmation, and Christian education. We discuss topics around the foundational points of our faith, how our faith impacts our lives, and how to navigate as a follower of Christ in middle school. There is no registration required, so students can join anytime.
