Worship and the Arts

Morning Prayers

Mondays through Fridays, 9:30 a.m. (Chapel)

Join us any weekday morning for this short (approximately 15-minute) service of intercessory prayer and praise, where we lift up the prayer requests of the congregation.

Contemplative and Meditative Prayer

Tuesdays, 5:30—6 p.m. (Chapel)

Meditation and contemplative prayer is a method of prayer that prepares us to receive the gift of experiencing God's presence within us that is closer than breathing, thinking, or consciousness itself. This method of prayer is both a relationship with God and a discipline to foster that relationship. All are welcome to join this group and experience the voice of God in the power of silence and meditation.



Ash Wednesday

Wednesday, Feb. 14, 7:30 a.m., 1 p.m., and 6:30 p.m. (Chapel)

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. Lent is a time when many Christians prepare for Easter by observing a period of fasting, repentance, simplicity, and spiritual discipline.

Through the imposition of ashes, Ash Wednesday emphasizes two themes: our sinfulness before God, and our human mortality. This year we mark our observance with the imposition of ashes and communion.

Weekly Communion During Lent

Wednesdays, Feb. 21 — March 27, 7:30 a.m. (Chapel)

Get your morning started right with the Lord's Supper. Throughout Lent receive communion as we focus on the Lenten theme of ritual. This is a short service (approximately 15-20 minutes) and will not include a sermon.

Lenten Worship and Study Series: "Who Do You Say That I Am: Discovering the Different Dimensions of Jesus"

Sundays, Feb. 18 — March 31, 8:30 a.m. and 11 a.m. (Sanctuary)

Throughout Lent we will prepare for the celebration of Easter by reflecting on the many different ways to understand and experience Jesus. Each week will feature a dimension of his identity and mission through worship, service, and study. A study guide will be available for individual use, and weekly small

groups will be formed to discuss each session. For more information see "Who Do You Say That I Am" in the discipleship and formation section on pages 18-19.

Palm Sunday

Sunday, March 24, 8:30 a.m. and 11 a.m. (Sanctuary)

Worship will feature music by our children's choirs and a processional with palm branches to commemorate the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem for the start of Holy Week. This year's service will follow Jesus from his triumphal entry into Jerusalem to his crucifixion on Calvary.

Holy Thursday

Thursday, March 28, 7:30 p.m. (Chapel and Courtyard)

Commemorate the day Jesus celebrated the Last Supper with his disciples. Later that night he went with them to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray. Join us for an intimate experience of the Last Supper with special liturgy, readings, and music that culminates in the courtyard as we remember his fateful night in the garden.

Good Friday Services

Friday, March 29, 12 p.m. (Chapel) and 7:30 p.m. (Sanctuary)

North Church will host a noon Good Friday service that will feature intercessory prayers for our community. In the evening join the Cathedral Singers and organist Dr. Heather Hinton for Théodore Dubois' musical setting of the "Seven Last Words of Christ."

Easter

Sunday, March 31, 8:30 a.m. and 11 a.m. (Sanctuary)

Celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ with a joyful and festive worship experience. This Sunday will be the culmination of the Lenten series as we celebrate "Jesus the Victor." At 8:30 a.m. we will have Holy Communion. At 11 a.m. the Carolers and the Cathedral Singers will share special music.

Earth Day Sunday Observance

Sunday, April 21, 8:30 a.m. and 11 a.m. (Sanctuary)

We will observe Earth Day with special prayers and readings as part of our Sunday services.

Special Music Sunday

Sunday, May 19, 11 a.m. (Sanctuary)

The Cathedral Singers will be joined by a string ensemble consisting of violins and cellos to play Franz Haydn's beautiful miniature mass, "Little Organ Mass" or "Short Mass of St. John of God," with organist Dr. Heather Hinton. Written between 1777-1778, Haydn composed it for the Brothers of Mercy's chapel organ and it was dedicated to their patron saint. The work is composed in the tradition of the missa brevis, in which some of the longer movements, particularly the Gloria and Credo, are condensed – i.e. the four voices of the chorus sing different words of the text simultaneously.

LGBTQ+ Fellowship



A Close-Up Look at Corinthians by Dr. Perry Kea Sundays, Feb. 18 — March 10, 9:45 — 10:45 a.m. (Club Room)

Paul's letters to several early Christ communities are our earliest Christian documents, even older than the written Gospels. Of Paul's letters, his correspondence with the Corinthian community (1 and 2 Corin-



thians) is the most extensive. These two letters constitute about 8 percent of the New Testament. We're going to take a close-up view of these letters with the following questions in mind:

- When did Paul write these letters?
- Where do the letters fit within the larger scheme of Paul's mission?
- Why did Paul write these letters?
- What issues was he addressing?
- How should we characterize Paul's relationship with this community?
- What glimpses and insights about the life of this firstgeneration Christ community do these letters provide?

- How do you see your life now?


- What is God calling you to do? To be?


Wednesdays, Feb. 21 — March 20, 5:30 p.m. (Fellowship Hall)


