North Church Sacred Places Challenge overview (building improvement fund)

- The North Church Sacred Places Challenge is a dedicated fund established for building improvements. Donations are reserved for eligible projects and may not be used for general operating expenses or ministry programs.
- For 2025, the Board of Directors has approved \$500,000 in masonry repairs to historic sections of the building, including the sanctuary.
- A grant from the Sacred Places Indiana Fund covers half the cost of the 2025 project, providing a 1:1 match for funds
 raised by North Church (up to \$250,000). The grant is part of a new Indiana Landmarks program funded by Lilly
 Endowment to support capital improvements at historic places of worship.
- Repairs are scheduled to be completed by early Fall 2025. Contributions are requested by September 1, 2025.
